

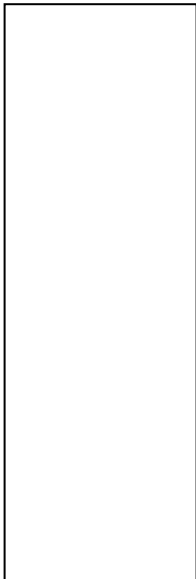

Did You Know?

Even though the facts about the wise men who went to see the baby Jesus are unknown, what is documented is the three gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh that were given. But what are those gifts and why were they given by the wise men?

During Biblical times, myrrh was used in making perfume and incense. The tree called Commiphora or DinDin produces the sap when the bark is cut. When the myrrh hardens it is usually made into powder, which was used in perfumes and as incense.

Frankincense is also a gum resin similar to myrrh from the tree Boswellia Thurifera found in the Middle East and Somalia. The younger the tree the more valuable and the better the sap. When the bark is cut, the sap is left to harden on the tree for about 3 months. When it is ready, it is scraped off into containers. Frankincense was used in incense for religious and government ceremonies. Although its use as incense was more popular, frankincense was also used in perfume.

The gift of gold that was given by the wise men does not need much of an explanation but was also a traditional gift given to any king or head of state.
